Often-times we reflect on the past year as we begin our new one. Our past year here at Roberts UCC was a good one. Although we are not yet where we would like to be in attendance, our giving remained strong, we completed many needed projects around the church, and started a bunch of new things while continuing to support and perform our usual ministries. Yet, as I talk with people, last year was a hard year for many. Inflation, medical issues, prescription drug shortages, and just being plain exhausted are just a few of the things which I hear regularly. I wonder though if we are simply caught up in negative times and having a hard time seeing our way out.

The passage above addresses that very issue. Isaiah reminds us that God has a plan for all of this, even if we do not see it. Something new is just around the bend and God is leading the way. As the Scripture says, "I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth; do you not perceive it?" Are you stuck looking backward and wishing for things to go back to the way they were? Has it been a long year with a lot of hills and valleys? Are you exhausted and needing someone else to take the reins for a while? Maybe it is time to look forward; to look with anticipation at what God has coming.

As a child I remember the excitement of new things. It didn't matter if it was a present, a trip, or a new friend. There was a palpable excitement around the whole thing. I would wait anxiously for my birthday and Christmas. I would dream about what the next adventures camping with my family would bring. I would wonder at what new things I would learn in school the next year. The things of the past were just that...past. I was looking for what was next, and the world had not yet tainted my view with all of its news of negativity. I wasn't worried about bills or food or where I would sleep. I didn't consider the time I had left or what I had done with the time I had been given. I didn't struggle all those adult things. Someone else had those things in hand. I just wanted to see what was next.

As we start this new year as a Church Family, I suggest we look ahead with that same excitement. What things will God do in and through us? What miracles will we see happen? What types of adventures will God lead us on? Of course, we will have the adult things we will need to take care of. We will need to pay our bills and maintain our ministries. There will be work to be done and issues which will arise. Yet, God has all this in hand. What new thing is God about to do here? We will never see it if we are constantly looking back and pining for what use to be.

Years ago, before Facebook, Tweets, Texts, Snaps, and Instagram Posts became the way to share motivational stories, people would forward things they found on the internet in emails. One that I remember vividly was called "Jenny's Pearls." It was all about a little girl who wanted a set of toy pearls one day as her mother and her were shopping. Wanting to teach her daughter responsibility, the mother made the little girl save up the money and buy them herself. The girl saved and worked hard in order to get that string of toy pearls and they became her most beloved treasure. So much so that her parents couldn't get her to take them off.

After a while the girl's father started asking her at bedtime if she loved him and of course she replied that she did. Then he would ask if he could have her pearls. Each time he did this she offered anything but her pearls. "Daddy, you know I love you. You can have my Teddy Bear/my Walkman (I told you this was an old email)/my favorite blanket, but please don't take my pearls. Each time, looking saddened, he would reply, "That's OK sweetheart, get some sleep." And he would shut off her light and close her door.

Finally, one night, as the routine played out once again and he was about to shut out the light, she called out in soft almost whisper of a voice. With tears in her eyes, she held out the toy pearls with a trembling hand and said, "Alright, Daddy. You can have my pearls." He gently reached out and took the pearls. Then reaching into his pocket he pulled out a jewelry box that contained a string of beautiful REAL pearls for his darling little girl.

You see, he was waiting for her to give up her dime store trinket in order to give her something even more lovely and precious. She would never have realized the true value of the gift if she continued to hold onto the things of the past. That's how it is with us and our Heavenly Father. So, let's look with excitement for the new things God is going to do in and through us. Let's look for the new thing God is doing in the world around us, rather than pining for the dime store trinkets we worked so hard to get ourselves.

What will happen on this adventure we are starting on with this new year? Let the excitement and anticipation of a child fill your hearts and minds as we let God lead us to true treasures and moments we can only have in the presence of the Divine.

Money raised by our team will benefit RUCC!


3) Come to Lakefront Park in Hudson WI on February 4 (between 12:15 & 1:30pm)to watch
