A New Dawning...

After the Sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning...

—Matthew 28:1

As I sit here in the office I am looking out to the window to the east and watching the most amazing sunrise. There are beautiful shades of deep purple fading up into pink. Above that they form a bow of deep orange fading gently to bright yellows. Then at the very top those yellows become brilliant bright white rays reaching up into the pale blue sky caressed by wisps of featherlike clouds. A beautiful new day is dawning and almost as with reverence the sun is bowing its head and raising its arms in praise of our Creator. It truly is an awe-inspiring way to begin this new day which God has created for all of us.

Even more amazing is the attitude of nature in this marvelous act of praise. Despite what happened yesterday, good or bad, what may happen today, or the hustle and bustle of the traffic frantically going by oblivious to the worship going on around it, nature continues its act of praise and thanksgiving in an epic display of love and reverence. It is going to happen regardless of what anyone else thinks of what it is doing. Some will notice its beauty and stop a moment just to admire and give thanks as well. Some will see it and find an opportunity to stop and take a picture which they will be able to use in order to make money to sustain themselves. Some won't even notice it is happening as they have their hearts and minds filled with all the other busyness they have in the day ahead. Some will be frustrated as the brightness shines in their eyes disrupting their view as they hurriedly rush towards the business of the day. Yet, nature continues with its grand "Hallelujah! praise be to God!"

This is a long way around to introduce what it is I wish to speak about in this article though. By the time you are going to be reading this, our Lenten Season will have started. In those 7 weeks of Lent, we will be preparing for our Easter Celebration. It is a time of soul searching, preparation, and repentance. We will share in the laughter of fellowship, study of Scripture, and marvel at the stories of the miracles of Jesus. With all we will be doing there will be much reason to rejoice. Then we will enter into that final week of Jesus' time with us here on earth, which we refer to as Holy Week. It was a dark week in the life of Jesus and the Disciples. Maundy Thursday we will engage in the Institution of the Lord's Supper, often referred to as the Last Supper. In the dark of night, Jesus will be betrayed and put on trial by his own people. On Friday, known as Good Friday, we will travel with Jesus to the cross and ultimately to his death. There will be fear and sadness for those who loved him most as they are not even able to tend to his battered and broken body because of the Sabbath. It will be dark times indeed. Yet, that is not even close to the end of the story...

Before Jesus' earthly body will be able to be tended to in preparation for burial, there will be another Son-rise. Despite what had happened the days before. Despite the hustle and bustle of the rest of the world around. Despite the beliefs, traditions, disbeliefs, or complete lack of caring of the people of the world. Come Easter morning, the Son is going to be raised by the power of God and nature itself is going to rejoice singing

Yet, it is not Jesus' death we are celebrating, but his resurrection...the Son-rise. Take the time over the next weeks to get up early and rejoice with nature each day. Let the sunrise each day brings remind you of the marvelous power and grace our God has shown us by bringing us to another day. Each day is a small Easter as each day is a New Day Dawning!

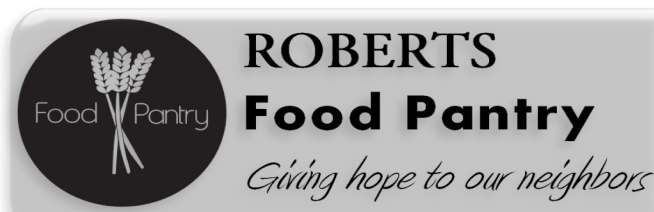

Update Reports:

Christian Education:

- Vacation Bible School: June 25th through the 28th from 6 to 8 P.M. The theme this year is "On the Case." In addition, there will be a potluck on Sunday, June 25th, beginning at 5 P.M., to kick off VBS.
- In RUCCUS, they will be incorporating building an ARK (Acts of Random Kindness).
- A weather policy was created. If the local school district is closed because of weather, there will be no RUCCUS activities that night.
- Family Lent challenge is to donate one item per day per family during Lent to give to the April Rummage Sale. This challenge begins on Ash Wednesday and concludes on Easter.
- Meetings will be held the third Monday of every month beginning at 6 P.M.
