# From the Pastor's Desk...

The Spiritual Practice of Stewardship
Yet Jesus also said, "I give you a new commandment:
love one another. Just as I have loved you, you must also love one another"
—John 13:34

We **continue** our journey of stewardship together this year by looking at yet another aspect of practicing stewardship. The spiritual practice of stewardship is fundamental to the Christian life. Yet, what does that **mean?** Spiritual Practice? For many, the idea of being spiritual has to do with prayer and meditation. So, is that what I need to do? Pray and meditate more? In a manner of speaking, yes. Though not in the typical way of thinking about it.

Prayer in one respect is about sitting and focusing on our relationship with God through conversation. Then, after the conversation we meditate, **reflect**, and listen, for a response in some way from God. That response is rarely through a spoken word and often comes through our living out life and seeing what God DOES in our lives. There is an action to it. So, I am suggesting that our prayer can also be communicated through our actions. What are we communicating to God in how we are living?

Now, let's take that back to Spiritual Practice. If being "spiritual" has to do with our relationship and communication with God, then the "practice" part has to do with how well we are communicating with God through our actions. Stewardship is a big portion of that. What are we doing with the gifts we are given? **And** what does that communicate to our God? Bear with me for just a little bit longer. I promise there is a point to all of this.

Stewardship as a Spiritual Practice is then about how we live out what we are claiming. Looking at the passage above, Jesus is talking to the people and telling them to love one another as He has loved them. Just before this the Gospel According to John has Jesus washing the Disciples feet. He is doing so to show them love. What is more important in that scenario though, is what is said **in** John 13:3, "Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands and that he had come from God and was going to God..." All those **who** Jesus was with were gifts to him from God; gifts which he needed to be a good steward of. He was living out the example not only for others to see, but for the glory of God. What we do with the gifts we are given matters.

Here is where the point comes in. Most of us are pretty good about loving others. We try to watch our speech and not be offensive. We try to be inclusive of those who are different from us. We try to make sure that those less fortunate know they are loved and cared for through the ministries we participate in and support. When we read the passage above, we are moved to do such things.

There are others who have been given to us as gifts though. Note that Jesus does not go out and wash the feet of the crowds. Instead, he washes the feet of the Disciples. It is an act of servitude and a gift of extravagant generosity. He is washing the feet of those **to whom he is closest**. Even though he is the leader and deserving of the servitude of the Disciples, he is serving them and doing so extravagantly.

I am challenging all of us to give serious thought to this (and I do mean ALL, **me** included). Our family and friends, personal and church, are extravagant gifts from God. How are we doing at serving them extravagantly? Treating them as if they are the most important thing in our world and going above and beyond for them? Are we loving them as Jesus has loved us, with forgiveness and grace beyond measure?

If I am going to be fully honest, often my family suffers in order for me to show love, forgiveness, and grace for others. I would like to say they are first on my mind, but too often I am more focused on the ministry

of love God has called me to and lose sight of the importance of this great gift I am given in the ones who make that ministry possible and fill me back up when I feel I am running on empty. Stewardship of those gifts is also so very important. That spiritual practice is something Jesus preaches often through his own actions. No words needed.

The same can be said for our church family. Sometimes we are so focused on the greater community and world and their needs, that we forget to look around us and see the needs we could be serving...of the gifts God has given us in the people around us...our church family. The practice of stewardship is so much more than just the finances we give. It is a way of living which was a gift from God. It is a way to see all that God has given us and ask ourselves how well we are doing in our care of those things. So, stewardship is a Spiritual Practice and one which has so many wonderful dimensions.

How are you doing in your Spiritual Practice of Stewardship? Could it use a little work? Are there places which have been neglected while you were focused on another aspect of your faith life or calling from God? There is hope and it is never too late to start this practice in your life.

The end of Chapter 13 in John shows this hope. Jesus foretells Peter denial after promising that even though Peter cannot come with Jesus right now to Glory, he will follow later. Even Peter, the one who Jesus is going to build his church upon, falls from following the life of Jesus perfectly, to the point of denying Jesus. Yet, he is promised eternal life with Christ. If even in his denial Peter can receive grace, forgiveness, and glory, imagine what God has in store for you.

Go out and be good stewards of the gifts God has given you...ALL the gifts God has given you! Love one another as Jesus has loved you!




#### RUCC CHURCH APP




