This is the 22nd year I am serving as the Pastor of a congregation through Advent and Christmas. Over that time, I have shared in many wonderful memories

within the 4 churches I have had the privilege of serving. Christmas Eve's have always been the highlight of the year for me as far as worship services go, especially the 11pm service. In the time I have been doing this, God has often graced services with some wonderful moments. Here are a few which will last with me forever.

The second Christmas Eve I served Carmel Union Congregational Church in Carmel, Maine. The early service had gone very well, and the Board of Deacons had come over to the parsonage in between our 7pm and 11pm services for a small gathering with food and laughter. Around 9pm everyone departed, and snow was gently falling. Someone had left the lights on in the church across the street and the glow coming from the windows seemed almost like candlelight in the darkness of the night with no streetlights. The light was inviting and warm, so I made my way over just to sit for a while inside the decorated sanctuary. I lit the candles on the Altar, Advent Wreath, and the end of each pew and plugged in the lights of our twenty-foot tree.

I sat quietly watching the glow of the candles when a soft voice asked if he could join me. I hadn't heard anyone come in, but there behind me was a frail looking older gentleman. I offered him a seat next to me and we conversed for a while. There was nothing specific discussed until he looked at me and asked if I performed baptisms. When I told him I did, he conveyed he had never been baptized and was wondering if I would be willing to baptize him.

I got the Baptismal Font out and ready and there, in the glow of the sanctuary, we baptized him. With tears in his eyes, he thanked me. Although I invited him to stay for the service, which would begin in about half an hour, he said he needed to get home and thanked me again as he left.

About a month later, a young family showed up for Sunday Worship. I talked with them after service and the husband told me they needed to come see the place where his grandfather had been baptized. It was the grandson of the man from Christmas Eve. That night, the man shared with his family gathered at his home that he had been baptized and what the experience was like for him. He passed away that night but had the chance to share one last wonderful Christmas Eve with his family. I was shocked and saddened until the grandson started to thank me because his grandfather had always said he didn't believe in God until that night, and he had felt moved to stop into the inviting glow of the church light outside. It is a night I will not forget, ever.

Another wonderful memory happened while I was serving Peace UCC in Iowa. It was during the 11pm service again. As is often the case, I struggled to get people to read or light candles. Just as the service was about to begin a young family who had attended a few times showed up with both of their young children dressed in their pajamas. As we started the Advent Candle lighting, their young daughter (who may have been four at the time) came running up wanting to help. I lifted her to my hip as we performed the lighting ceremony. When I went to put her down, she clung to me. I performed the rest of the service with her there on my hip as we read and sang. She is now in her teens and has grown into a fine young lady, but she will forever be that little girl to me. I hope you realize how blessed I feel to have watched you grow, Brooklyn, and the photo of us lighting those candles still remains one of my favorites.

The final one I want to share happened here. It was our first 11pm Christmas Eve service. It is always a much more intimate service with the ones who come to attend that service. That night just before the candlelight ceremony, the Spirit moved me to call everyone up around the tree for a prayer. We remained after the prayer and began the Candle lighting ceremony in a semi-circle around the tree. There in the glow of the candles we stood singing Away in the Manger and Silent Night. No one needed the slides on the screen, we stood there looking around at the family which had gathered there as the notes rang out. As we sang the final verse of silent night the accompanist stopped playing and we continued to sing. The warmth of the notes, the glow of the candles, and the looks of peace and love on people's faces will forever remain in my heart as one of the fondest services I have ever had the privilege of performing.

There are so many more moments of laughter and love I could share, but these stand out at the moment to me. Thank you all for the past 6 years of fond memories and wonderful moments in ministry. May God bless you on your journeys this Advent season and give you the Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love the Christ child brought so many years ago.

STEWARDSHIP UPDATE (also from the Pastor...)

We had our Commitment Celebration on Sunday, December 16th and what a wonderful time to be together. As we talked about our Stewardship and what it meant during the celebration, I wanted to share with all of you some of the things which we had to celebrate. Our stewardship is about so much more than the money we give and paying bills. One way to see this is to look at the ministries we do here at Roberts Congregational UCC and the real impact they are having on the world. Here is a little bit of what we discussed and celebrated last Sunday!

We spend 19% of our budget **Connecting with God**...approximately \$54,000. Another 27% is spent on **Living by Faith.** Which translates

into approximately \$74,000. 28% of our budget goes to **Being Known by**

Love...approximately \$76,000.00. And 26% of our budget covers Cultivating Hope...almost

\$73,000. This is just the financial stuff though.

We were able to track approximately 5,300 hours of volunteer time in this building.

That is an average of 102 hours a week or 14.5 hours a day of time given to the ministries of this church by members and friends, our church family. That is an average of 14 hours per day given to this congregation.

The average wage in the United States in 2023 has been just over \$28/hr.

That translates into \$405 per day, or \$2,835 per week, or a yearly total of \$147,435 which is given in time at \$28/hr.

That is staggering to think about and also something to remember when we look around and see what our members and friends are doing for our ministries for God.

Over the last year we have had 16,951 points of contact.

That is someone who has attended a worship service, come in for aid or counseling,

been to the food pantry, been helped by one of our outreach programs,

or receive some other form of contact through our congregation.

These are all times which God has an opportunity to touch the life of someone because of the generosity of all of you. ORDER NOW FOR CHRISTMAS

16,951 points of contact. That is an average of 46 a day.

46 individuals a day have the opportunity to know our God's love

because of all that you and others in this congregation so generously give.

What is even more staggering is the ripple effect this has in the world.

Each of those people goes out into the world taking that love with them touching others.

Imagine what that number would look like if we were able to track it!

It takes time, talents, and finances to do that though. When we look at our time donated, 5,280 hours,

that means for every 19 minutes volunteered 1 person was touched.

Every hour volunteered more than 3 people were touched.

In 8 hours, you could reach 26 people.

Last year we had a total of 56 giving units in the church. A giving unit is a household or organization which has given to the church. Which means to reach our budget we need each giving unit to give \$13.54/per day. We realize that isn't feasible for every household, it is just an average number. Some of us can give more and others less. Just like one person might have more time to give than the next. That \$13.54/day translates into it costing \$0.29 per contact per unit per day. 29 cents for the chance to change a life? That seems much more doable. We need your help in time talents and finances. We are all feeling the crunch of the rising costs of living. Yet, we are doing so much good! Would you be able to help financially, or maybe already do, could find it in your heart and budget to help just a little more? Can you find a way to give just a little more time to help? Do you have a talent you might be able to share? For every dollar we give, every hour we give extra, 3 more people could be reached. We are doing some awesome work. We have great reason to celebrate. Will you help us to continue to reach as many people as possible with the ministries of Roberts Congregational UCC?
