Twelve very short weeks is all there is left before I start Sabbatical and there is so much to get done. It doesn't seem possible that it is almost here. I know for many of you twelve weeks seems like a lot of time, and in some ways it is. I have spent the better part of a year though designing, planning, and editing what will happen and be done over the three months I will be out of the office. I have also been approached by some who have read the previous articles asking if I have any time planned for rest and family. I do and I will outline in this article how all of this will work together.

First, the matter of family, I am guessing just having me around so much is going to be an adjustment for us all. We have already begun to work out logistics of things like a space to work in the house, getting used to routines they have which I am generally not a part of, and talking about various things we will have the opportunities to do together. - Met with and still waiting for a proposal from an outside accounting firm to handle the church treasury role. Patti and Diane have been keeping up with treasurer duties to date.
- Sidewalk lifting and repairs approved by the Trustees, proposal signed and a check for 50% down is being issued so we can get this work done asap. Total cost of repairs: \$1300.00.

Church Board Team:

• Church Board Team update: Duane reminded all to be at a congregational small group meeting. They will be held on April 6th and the 14th following worship. There will also be meetings on Thursday, April 11th at 7 P.M. and Saturday, April 13th at 10 A.M. Tentatively, a congregational meeting will be called in May to vote on proceeding with the process.

Pastor's Report:

- Pastor Burt will be attending the ordination of his son, Uriah, on April 14th. Becky Davidson will be covering service on April 14th.
- There was an average of 12 people attending the book study during Lent.
- Pastor Burt will be taking his sabbatical from July 1st to September 30th. CE currently has signed up to cover August 4th and September 8th. Trustees will be covering July 28 and Sept. 1. Pastoral Emergency_coverage during the month of September will be covered by Paul Backstrom from Gethsemane Lutheran in Baldwin. Becky Davidson will be available to help with funerals.
- The Boy Scouts food drive will be happening April 26th and 27th. There is a possibility they will be camping inside the evening of the 26th.
- Good Neighbor Days: Cross Lutheran has inquired about changing the Ecumenical Good Neighbor Day Service. One year to be held at our church and the next year at Cross. A motion was made by Brett and seconded by Duane that the Ecumenical Service for Good Neighbor Days should remain in the park. Motion was carried by the Board of Deacons.
- Pastor Burt has become part of the On-call Chaplaincy program at the River Fall Hospital. He will be on an 8 week rotation, covering nights and weekends.
- The Rise Organization has been coming in and doing some sweeping, mopping, washing of tables, vacuuming, and dusting for us. Thank you to the volunteers who continue to come in and help keep our facility clean and upkept.
- Pastor Burt renewed the floors in the Fellowship Hall and the hallway between the Narthex and the Fellowship Hall. The Narthex and the Sanctuary need to be done yet. Pastor Burt also got the vacuum cleaner in the Sound Room running again.
- Pastor Burt is requesting all groups to think of ideas for making our church more visible in the community. Possible suggestions: 1) Organized group of volunteers, wearing a shirt with our church name on it, cleaning the ditch for the mile in front of the church. 2) Restoring the equipment in the park to make it more inviting to families.

SMALL GROUP CONGREGATIONAL MEETINGS HELD IN APRIL.

The Church Board Team would like to thank everyone who participated in one of the small group congregational meetings held in April. We shared information about the team's mission and our vision for moving from a board-based church governance approach to a teams-based approach. We asked you to share your thoughts, questions, and opinions. A summary of these discussions and the common questions are shared below. Many positive comments and thoughts came out of the discussion of teams-based governance, including:

- This is a positive change toward future growth.
- The model is designed with the idea of revitalizing us and getting more people involved.
- It offers better opportunity to include non-members in our activities and fosters outreach.
- It allows for "Team-Hopping" to find my best fit.
- It gives people the opportunity to try something different without committing to a long-term board commitment.
- This approach would not require me to commit to a specific term or amount of time.
- The boards that are already taking a team approach are having great success with it (i.e., VBS, food pantry, women's fellowship, SHIFT).
- It will get more people involved.

There was a common theme to the questions and discussion. We have tried to address these below:

Who will be making the decisions?

Our vision is that a Leadership Board made up of 6-10 members of the church would be elected by the congregation at the annual meeting as our boards are elected currently. This board will be responsible for working with the various teams and for making decisions. Each member of the Leadership Board will be a "representative" for various teams. Teams will be fairly autonomous but will be accountable to the Leadership Board and the congregation. There will be term limits for service and new members will be elected as old members' terms are over. The Leadership Board will legally represent the congregation. All financial decisions would go before the Leadership Board much as they go before Trustees today. More information will be provided to further define the roles and functions of the Leadership Board in advance of the May 19 congregational meeting.

• Will current teams like VBS, food pantry, women's fellowship, or SHIFT be disbanded?

No, there is no plan to disband any existing teams. These teams will actually be used to demonstrate how well the teams-based approach works. We will be evolving the Deacons, Trustees and CE boards to explore and create new teams to fulfill our ministries. For example, we may evolve the CE board to not only include a team for VBS, but also teams for RUCCUS, adult education, Bible Study, teen fellowship, etc. Rather than having a CE board that has responsibility for all

Christian education, each separate team could be made up of people who are excited about further developing the various ministries.

When will the process start if we vote to move forward and how will it work?

Once we have had the vote to move forward, a new team consisting of 6-8 congregation members will be formed immediately. The new team will work in tandem with the existing Church Board Team for a period of time for further discussion of the teams-based process and planning. The new team will then begin working on the detailed structure of the Leadership Board and they will develop a plan for evolving the current boards into the teams-based model. Eventually, this team will also work to rewrite the by-laws and church constitution to reflect the changes in our governance.

This process will not happen all at once; it will occur very gradually and the congregation will be looked to for input, decision-making, and further voting prior to changes occurring.

On Sunday, May 19 following worship, we will be holding a special meeting of the congregation where we will ask for a congregational vote to support further exploring the teams-based model and developing a plan for moving forward. Assuming the vote passes, we will be looking for a representative from each current board and 2-3 congregation members to be a part of a new team that will lead this effort.


