PASTOR'S For I will restore health to you, and your wounds I will heal, says the Lord...

Hurt, heartache, physical and mental pain, seem to be so prevalent today. With so much happening in the world and the way in which our world has taught us to be, hope can be hard to come by. Yet, there is hope. We are not alone.

Over the last couple of years, I seem to spend more and more time with people who have lost hope or at the very least are seeking some form of healing for where life has left them. Our world has, and too often even our faith traditions have taught us to be humble and not focus on our needs. Our needs are not as significant as the needs of others. I, myself, am even guilty of this and as I sit here writing this am acutely aware of how often words like, "There is always someone who has it worse than we do," have come out of my mouth.

The truth is, when we are in need of healing these platitudes are not helpful. They may even make things worse. Our need for healing is very real and too often put to the bottom of our list of things to focus on. Rather than seeking the help we need, we look at the plight of others and turn our attention there. This type of deflection can only happen for so long though before our hurt and need for healing overwhelms us. This can lead us to the point of not being able to help others or ourselves.

To make matters more difficult, we add in the idea that we need to be strong and not burden others, or our God, with what we have now deemed a small problem in comparison to others. Our faith must be strong and that should be enough. If I just pray a little harder, have a little more faith, everything will work out. "Our God has this." "God won't give you more than you can handle." "God must be testing me." "What did I do to make God mad at me?" These are all things which run through our mind when all our prayer and faith haven't seemed to be enough. We are still stuck in a place where the pain and hurt seem almost unbearable at times. We put our faith aside and turn to science. If God can't/won't help, maybe they can. Why must the two be separate? Why do we separate our faith lives from our everyday living?

The truth is there is hope. Our God has not abandoned us. Again and again, we find statements like our scripture quote above in the Bible. Why isn't God helping me though? What did I do or am I doing that God has decided to punish me like this? We are not being punished. It is quite the opposite. It is time that we rewrite and redirect this type of thought. God has blessed us with some extremely helpful worldly things to help us heal. Medicine, therapy, medications, people, and family to name but a few. They are not separate from God. They are God's gifts intended to help heal us. We have to ask and be willing to receive.

Where are you at the moment? Are you seeking healing? Is your heart broken? Do you feel all alone, wondering aimlessly? Do you always have to be the strong one holding everything together? It may be time to allow God to be a part of your everyday and look at what gifts are there. It isn't weakness to ask for help. It isn't burdening others to allow healing to happen by seeking support.

Just look at Jesus. He asked for his Disciples to come and support him. He sent them out to help others. He sought their friendship. On the eve before his death, he even asked them to come sit with him while he prayed. He was in the darkest place of his earthly life. That evening in the garden, he didn't go through all of their needs and try to meet them. Instead, he asked for their support. He asked them to just be there. He focused on allowing God to heal his wounded heart. He accepted the gifts God had given him to help him through.

It is important to note that there was still pain and the reality of the situation still happened. It didn't all just magically go away. It did help him to have the strength and faith to get through, though.

Are you in need of healing? Seek God. Seek God through prayer and faith. Also seek God through the everyday, worldly gifts God has placed all around you. Life is not easy. Faith is not easy. Help is out there, and God has made it so. You are enough. Even when you feel you are not. Healing is possible. Jesus says in Matthew 20:16, "So the last will be first, and the first will be last." It is in the context of those receiving gifts, but there is another way of looking at this. What if we were to understand it this way, "The served will help heal, and the healers will be served." Meaning that even the healers need others at times. Sometimes we simply have to realize we need help, and it is ok not to be the strongest person in the room.

Wherever you are today, seek God's help through faithful prayer and recognize the gifts God has placed around you. Asking for help from others is sometimes the greatest prayer we can have!



NEW VISITATION MINISTRY TEAM: FULFILLING THE CALL OF MATTHEW 25

We are excited to announce the launch of a new **Visitation Ministry Team** at Roberts UCC, inspired by the words of Jesus in

Matthew 25:34 - 40

"I was sick and you visited me... Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."

This new ministry team seeks to connect members of our church family through meaningful visits — bringing comfort, encouragement, and the love of Christ to those who are homebound or in need of personal connection.

Here's how it works:

- We are forming a Visitation Team made up of caring individuals who are willing to visit others on a regular basis. You don't need special training just a willing heart and a little time to share.
- We are also creating a list of "visitees" those in our congregation who would appreciate a visit, such as shut-ins, those recovering from illness, or others in need of encouragement.
- The Visitation Team will coordinate visits to ensure everyone on the list receives care, prayer, and fellowship. We will also keep track of visits to help us serve consistently and faithfully.
