

For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven. - Ecclesiastes 3:1

For years now, I have caught myself making the statement, "It'll be easier once I am X years old." Always expecting that right around the corner I am going to be hit with a huge dose of wisdom that makes the next season or chapter of life seem simple and easy. So far, it hasn't happened. Each new chapter has its own new quirks and idiosyncrasies. This has led me to a new approach to looking to the future. It has led me to a very different understanding of the importance of Faith.

When I was still in grade school, a teacher of mine turned me onto a style of book called "Choose Your Own Adventure." The way it worked was you would read for a bit and then there was a choice to be made with anywhere from 2 to 4 possible choices. Depending on your choice, you were directed to go to a specific page and read on from there. Then at the end of that next section there was another set of choices until you hit a section that had an ending. The possibilities seemed unending as you could always go back to the beginning and make different choices. Wouldn't it be nice if that was the way life was? If you didn't like the outcome of the choice you made, you could go back and start all over. That is not how it works though.

Instead, we have a very different scenario. We make choices and have to live with the consequences (good or bad) of those choices. With each chapter and choice, we gain knowledge and experience. That doesn't mean there won't be twists and turns in the next chapter. The wisdom we have gained may or may not help with the next set of choices; our mistake is in looking at this as situational. If you are like I am, you live situation to situation. You hope and pray for things to just get a little easier the next time and feel varying degrees of letdown each time it doesn't happen. Faith asks something different of us.

Faith asks us to look at the past and see where God has been with us. It asks us to look and evaluate where we have followed where God was leading and when we did things our way. It asks us to trust that the author of this grand adventure of life has our best interests in mind when we are asked to follow. Rather than living situation to situation and making choices based on our limited wisdom, it asks us to look at the wisdom of the ages and make the best choice possible of where we see

God asking us to follow. It doesn't promise an easy road. It promises a road which leads to peace and trust. It doesn't ask us to follow blindly. It asks us to pray and meditate, to consider where God is in our lives at all times and make our choices from there.

It is a grand fallacy to think that following blindly will lead us down the right path. This isn't heresy, it is just human nature. When we follow blindly it isn't faith, but foolishness. How can we trust something we do not know, cannot observe, and do not have a relationship with? Our very nature doesn't allow that and that is when we begin to mix our emotions and desires into our faith. The problem becomes we are not following where God is leading. We are telling ourselves what we want to hear, what someone else has told us is true for us, and eventually this lets us down in a hard way.

I am not saying we do not need guidance and shouldn't listen to what others say. I am not saying there are not times we don't have to step onto a path we cannot see the end of. I am saying that Faith is about the long game. It is about taking the experience of our ancestors, our friends, Scripture, and our own experience of the past and truly working through it to see where God is leading us specifically. There are many tools for doing this and we need to find the ones which work for us. Rather than waiting for tomorrow to be easier, we need to work at developing this connection and relationship to build trust in where God has taken us so far and see where we may have strayed and been led away from what God had intended for us.

Peace can be found in that trust and relationship. Like any good relationship though, it takes work and being able to take responsibility for our part in it. The seasons will continue to change. Our wisdom can help, but it is only a part. Let's journey together to see where God is calling us all, individually and as a church family!




