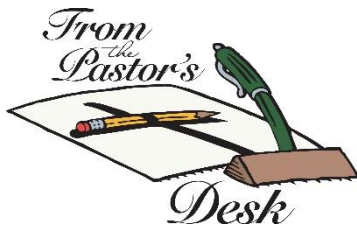

The Church of Yesterday...

Ministry is one of those constantly evolving things and over the past 5 years it has evolved at a rate that makes a pastor's head spin. That is the case for many things in the world, however. Many of us feel the strains of the breakneck speeds that the world has changed in. One of the major ways in which things have changed though is a very good, but complicated thing and that is the various ways in which we reach out with worship services. Here at Roberts UCC, there has been a major shift in this area.

When I started here, we had Sunday morning worship at 10am, monthly nursing home services at Heritage Court, and the occasional special service (Christmas Eve, Easter, etc.). Eight years later, we are offering many opportunities for people to worship. We still have the ones listed above with an average attendance of 41 people per service for regular Sunday Worship at 10am and an average of 5 people attending the monthly Heritage Court services.

We have added to this our weekly Online Worship and RUCCUS Worship which happens the 1st and 3rd Wednesday evening September through May. The addition of these two services allows us to reach more people with an average attendance of 24 machines logging in for the online services and an average of 27 in attendance for our RUCCUS Worship.

I bring this up for two reasons. There have been more than a few of you who have been concerned about our Sunday morning attendance, which numerically is down significantly. Our pews are not nearly as full as they once were on Sunday mornings. That is just a fact. It is a fact that most congregations (in many faiths) are dealing with. The second is to bring a little hope to this situation.

By adding these other services we have actually increased our reach. That average of 27 for online worship counts only devices, not how many are watching them. I am aware, for a fact, that many of those watching are watching as families and couples. The standard I have found to use when calculating this is to use a factor of 1.8 people per device. In other words, our best estimate is that we have approximately 43 people in attendance for each online service. By moving our Sunday School to Wednesday nights and adding a modified worship service to it we have been reaching an additional 27 individuals (parents and children) who are there regularly where we were seeing sporadic at best for Sunday morning attendance.

The Online services have kept us connected with many who may not have any worship at all if there was only the in-person worship (those who cannot make it for whatever reason). It has also allowed us to help our shut-ins to still have a regular style worship service to continue their spiritual journey with. The RUCCUS Services have kept our younger people attending more often and also gotten them more involved in leadership and volunteering. So, although it looks like we are down in attendance, we are actually seeing more involvement and reach than it seems to the naked eye.

The Church of Yesterday...

The whole truth is that in 2019 we saw an average of 75 people in attendance on Sunday morning reaching an average of 325 people a month with worship with an Active Membership of 215. According to last year's count we have an Active Membership of 170 and are reaching an average of 343 people a month with worship. This says nothing of the other ways in which we reach out.

Although things may not look like they once did and the metrics for measuring have changed, we are still doing better today than we were 5 years ago. There are still adjustments to be made and things to figure out. God is still here though – watching, guiding, and living with us! Let's rejoice in this new thing God is doing.

Despite the cold temperature outside, many shoppers lined up to fill boxes with goodies.

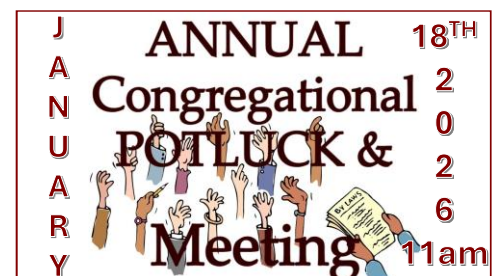
The sale brought in close to \$550! We couldn't have done it without you and are truly appreciative of your support.

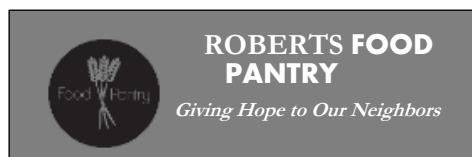
